Decorative Canister Flowers

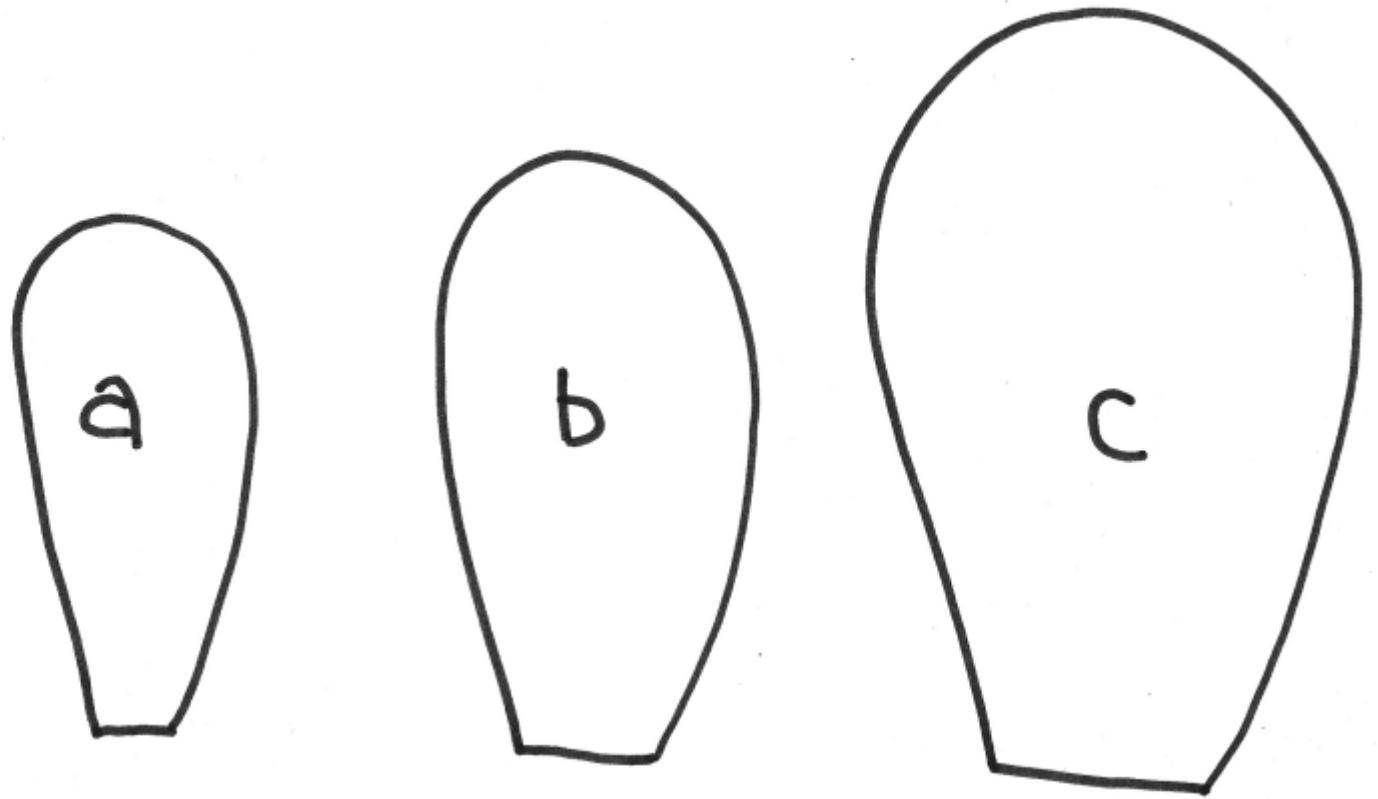

Supplies/Materials

- Fabric Scraps
- Elastic Cord (2 Yards)
- Pattern for Petals (PETAL Pattern)
- Interfacing (<https://www.nancysnotions.com/t-shirt-project-fusible-interfacing.html>)
- Fixion Marker (<https://www.nancysnotions.com/fine-point-erasable-clicker-gel-pens.html>)
- Sewing Machine/Thread/Bobbin
- Long Pins (<https://www.nancysnotions.com/long-pearlized-pins-set.html>)
- Scissors
- Large Buttons
- Needle and Thread
- Glue Gun

Directions:

1. Iron fusible interfacing to back of fabric scraps.
2. Use pattern and Fixion marker to trace seven petals of each size on back of ironed on interfacing.
3. Cut out petals.
4. Cut three 1 ½ inch squares from scrap.
5. Pin A sized petals to one, B sized petals to another and C sized petals to third.
6. Sew the petals in a circle to the square scrap.
7. Remove pins and sew again to reinforce.
8. Using a needle and thread, stitch loosely around the center.
9. Pull stitching tight to cinch the center and pull the flower in.
10. Tie it off and trim excess thread.
11. Measure elastic cord around a canister then cut it to size.
12. Sew the cord to the back center of the flower.
13. Cover a button with fabric using a glue gun.
14. Glue the fabric covered button to the center of the flower.
15. Place the flower band over the canister.
16. Do steps 6-12 for all three sizes.
