Supplies/Materials

- 1 Yard Base Fabric
- Fabric Scraps
- 2 Yards Wide Ribbon

- Sewing Machine/Thread/Bobbin

- Scissors
- Laura Kelly Flower #6 Die by Sizzix
- Die Cut Machine


Directions:


1. Use fabric scraps to create a messy, scrap quilt piece that measures 24 inches by 15 inches. The individual pieces can be as big or small as one prefers.
2. Measure from the center of the top to mark off 16 inches (8 inches to each side).
3. Draw a line with the Fixion marker from each end of this mark to the bottom corner.
4. Cut the sides off using a rotary cutter and a cutting mat.
5. Cut out a matching sized piece of fabric from your base fabric to be the backside of the apron.
6. Cut out a pocket from the base fabric using the pattern (POCKET Pattern).
7. Trace jelly roll mini template shapes on to the back of fabric scraps with a Fixion (washable) marker.
8. Cut shapes from fabric scraps.
9. Pin shapes to quilted piece and sew on using zig zag stitch.
10. Remove pins.
11. Use the Laura Kelly flower die from Sizzix to cut a flower. Use scissors to cut a large circle to put in the middle of the flower.
12. Pin then sew flower to pocket.
13. Remove pins.
14. Fold the top of the pocket back about ½ inch and sew it using a zig-zag stitch. This will keep it from fraying once complete.
15. Pin pocket to center of quilted piece and sew on using zig-zag stitch being sure to leave top open.
16. Remove pins.
17. Place the two fabric pieces facing each other with two 30 inch pieces of ribbon pinned in to top of each side. The ribbon will be in between the two fabric pieces. The backside of the fabric pieces will be showing.
18. Pin in place ensuring that ribbon will not be sewn into sides.
19. Sew around the apron leaving a 4 inch opening on the bottom.
20. Remove pins.
21. Flip right-side out.
22. Pin opening closed and zig-zag stitch all the way around apron which will close the opening and finish off the apron.
23. Zig-zag stitch again around the pocket. This will stabilize entire apron.
24. Wear it and enjoy.
